For instance, ENGL 403 (Shakespeare 1) can satisfy either the Core Shakespeare requirement or the Literatures of the World Concentration British or American literature requirement. However, one course canfulfill one requirement in more than one Concentration. For instance, ENGL 352 (English Structure) would satisfy the ENGL Writing/Linguistics Courses requirement in the Professional Writing Concentration and the ENGL Linguistics requirement in the Linguistics Concentration for a student completing both the Linguistics and the Professional Writing Concentrations.
